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# Travel tips

## PUBLIC TRANSPORT

- **Metro:** fastest vehicle, Milan has 5 lines: red M1, green M2, yellow M3, blue M4 and lilac M5
- **Trams and buses:** Great for more central areas or for a scenic ride, they may be slowed down by traffic compared to the metro.

### Tickets

- single run (90'): € 2,20
- 24-hour marigold: € 7,60
- 72-hour ticket: €15,50

The ticket includes: metro, tram, bus and train (in the urban area).

14-year-old minors travel free, with a valid ID.

## WEBSITES FOR EXCURSIONS AND ACTIVITIES

- **GetYourGuide:** offers a wide range of excursions around Milan
- **Viator:** a platform that offers tours and activities that can be booked in advance, such as food and wine tours
- **Musement:** offers cultural and tourist activities in Milan, such as entrances to museums and historic sites

These sites allow you to filter excursions by type and show reviews from other tourists.

## 1 - Duomo Cathedral

The cathedral, symbol of the city. Don't miss the opportunity to get to the terraces to enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view of Milan and the Alps in the distance.

## 2 - Vittorio Emanuele II Gallery

A few steps from the Duomo is the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, one of the most elegant shopping galleries in the world, known for its glass ceilings and mosaic floors. You can go shopping or simply admire the architecture.

## 3 - Take a break in a milanese cafe

A coffee and a pastry in one of Milan's historic cafés, such as Caffè Cova, Pasticceria Marchesi, or Panificio Pattini.

## 4 - La Scala Theatre

If you have some time to spare, visit La Scala, one of the most famous opera houses in the world. You can take a guided tour of the museum and theater to learn about its legendary history.

## 4 - Lunch in Brera

Head to the Brera district, one of the most charming areas of Milan. You can have lunch at a typical restaurant like Trattoria Torre di Pisa or Osteria di Brera and taste Milanese dishes, such as risotto alla milanese or cutlet.

## 5 - Pinacoteca di Brera

After lunch, visit the Pinacoteca di Brera, one of Milan's most important art galleries, which houses works by masters such as Caravaggio, Raffaello, and Mantegna.

## 6 - Sforza Castle

Just a few steps from Brera, stroll to the Sforza Castle, a historic fortress housing museums and art collections. You can also relax in its beautiful gardens.

## 7 - Aperitivo at Navigli

In the evening, head to the Navigli district, famous for its canals and numerous bars and clubs. Enjoy a traditional Milanese aperitif, accompanied by appetizers and perhaps a cocktail at one of the bars on the Navigli.

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# Travel Tips

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## Day 1

- **Cathedral of the Duomo:** the symbol of the city, get on the terraces for a panoramic view of Milan.
- **Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II:** one of the most elegant shopping galleries in the world, known for its glass ceilings and mosaic floors.
- **Take a break at a Milanese café,** such as Caffè Cova, Pasticceria Marchesi, or Panificio Pattini.
- **Museum of Novecento ('900):** Explore the vast collection of 20th-century art, with works by artists such as Giorgio de Chirico, Lucio Fontana, and Umberto Boccioni.
- **Lunch in Brera,** one of the most charming areas of Milan. We recommend Trattoria Torre di Pisa and Osteria di Brera.
- **Teatro alla Scala:** one of the most prestigious theaters, you can also visit its Museum to learn about the history and productions of the theater.
- **The Sforza Castle,** a historic fortress that houses museums and art collections.
- **Aperitivo at Navigli:** In the evening, head to the Navigli district and enjoy a traditional Milanese aperitif.

## Day 2

- **Santa Maria delle Grazie and the Last Supper:** be sure to book in advance to see Leonardo da Vinci's masterpiece, a must-see in Milan.
- **Pinacoteca di Brera:** one of Milan's most important art galleries, it houses works by masters such as Caravaggio, Raffaello, and Mantegna.
- **Prada Foundation (Fondazione Prada):** If you're passionate about contemporary art, visit the Prada Foundation, which hosts cutting-edge art exhibitions and installations.
- **Lunch in Porta Romana:** a lively neighborhood full of traditional restaurants and trattorias, where you can enjoy a typical Milanese meal.
- **Fashion Quadrilateral:** Milan is the fashion capital, so don't miss a stroll between Via Montenapoleone, Via della Spiga, and other elegant luxury shopping streets.
- **Aperitivo at Corso Como:** end the day with an aperitif in the famous Corso Como area, a Milan neighborhood full of trendy clubs.

# Near Milano

## Monza

### ART, HISTORY AND NATURE

Visit the Royal Villa and its vast gardens, ideal for a stroll.

Explore Monza's historic center, including the Cathedral of San Giovanni Battista and Piazza Trento e Trieste. If you have time, stroll through Monza Park, one of the largest walled parks in Europe.


Visit a winery with wine tasting. Stop in Iseo, a picturesque town from which we recommend a boat ride to Mount Isola.



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# Day 3

- **Leonardo da Vinci Museum of Science and Technology:** one of the largest museums in Italy, where you can discover exhibitions about science, technology, and inventions of Leonardo da Vinci.
- **Milan Triennale:** museum of contemporary art and design that shows more innovative architecture, visual art and design.
- **San Siro Stadium and Football Museum:** here you can take a tour of the stadium and visit the Football Museum, which celebrates the history of AC Milan and Inter, and the legendary players who played there.
- **Feltrinelli Foundation:** if you are interested in contemporary culture, exhibitions on social and political issues are hosted here.
- **Piazza Gae Aulenti and Bosco Verticale:** they are located in the Porta Nuova area, visit Piazza Gae Aulenti, known for its contemporary architecture.
- **Aperitif in Isola:** it is an area known for its vibrant atmosphere and trendy bars. It is an ideal place to relax and enjoy a drink before dinner.
